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## CHAPTER ONE

### 1.0 Introduction

#### 1.1 Backgrounds to the Study

In many countries today, education is considered as an important tool in achieving political, social and economic ends. Even at international levels, education is emphasized in universal declaration of human rights laid down in 1948. Article 26 says: "everyone has the right to education. Education shall be free at least in the elementary and fundamental states." Fafunwa, M: the history of education in Kenya in the formal setting can be traced back to the coming of European missionaries of the church missionary society (C.M.S).
