ABSTRACT

The study will aim at establishing the impact of violent robberies on the victims in Kenya within Ngong town, Kerarapon area. This study on impact of violent robberies comes in the background of public and Government concern over high rates of violent robberies in Ngong town. The purpose of this study will be to investigate the impact of violent robberies in the town. The ultimate goal will be to gather data and information that would assist in formulation and implementation of effective prevention and control policies and other interventions.
