

**ASSESSMENT ON THE EFFECTS OF TRIBAL CLASHES ON PRIMARY
EDUCATION IN LANGWENDA ZONE, KURESOI DISTRICT**

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ABSTRACT

The study sought to explore the effects of tribal clashes on primary school children in Langwenda Zone, Kuresoi District.

The researcher used the following objectives;

- i. To identify causes of tribal clashes in Langwenda Zone, Kuresoi District.
- ii. To identify effects of tribal clashes on primary school childrens LangwendaZone, Kuresoi District.
- iii. To identify ways in which the effects of tribal clashes on primary school children in Langwenda Zone, Kuresoi District.

The researcher used the descriptive survey method. The eclectic approach was used where both qualitative and quantitative methods were used to accommodate all the objectives.

The area of study was Langwenda Zone in Kuresoi District. This area has frequent episodes of tribal clashes reported to the Police Station. The researcher sought to ascertain whether there was any practical link between the violence and school performance.

The researcher interviewed with the help of two trained research assistants. They wrote down the responses on separate response sheets. For the tests, the interviewers wrote whole statements.

The researcher analyzed the data in terms of percentages. It was presented on tables, graphs, pie charts and area charts.

The study found that:

Political incitements from powerful politicians was the major cause. Children's academic performance was largely affected by tribal clashes in the area of study. Political leaders were seen as the ones with the greatest responsibility in addressing the issues in the area of study.
