EFFECTS OF ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE TO THE DISCIPLINE IN
SCHOOLS IN MAKUYU DIVISION IN MURANG'A SOUTH SUB

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ABSTRACT

The primary purpose of this study was to investigate into the effects on discipline occasioned by alcohol and drug abuse in secondary schools in Makuyu Division and the possible solutions to these challenges. Out of the twenty seven (27) schools, nine (9) were purposively sampled. This represents 30% of the schools in this division. Out of the nine (9) schools, one (1) is girls boarding, one (1) is boys boarding, three (3) are mixed day schools, three (3) are mixed day and boarding and one (1) is private. Each school provides a total of forty (40) respondents, ten (10) students from each form, the deputy head teacher and one (1) teacher for guidance and counselling. Three hundred and sixty (360) students were randomly selected and nine (9) deputies and nine (9) teachers purposively sampled because they are from the same schools to facilitate consistency in the research process. Three objectives were covered in the study. One self-report questionnaire with both closed and open ended questions was administered to each student and teacher counsellors. Students' questionnaires were filled and collected, there and then. Teacher's questionnaires were given a day before and collected on the day when students are filling theirs. Data was collected by use of questionnaires and analyzed quantitatively. The results were presented in frequency distribution and percentages. Data analysis was carried out using the Statistical Package for Social Sciences (SPSS) utilizing descriptive and statistical analysis procedures. Descriptive statistics to be used include frequency and percentages.

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
