ABSTRACT

Despite the rapid growth of education in Kenya since independence, retention and completion of education system has been a major and greater constrain in public primary school. Many young girls has been dropping out of school before completing primary education. National leaders have been demanding, communities and families to take major step to retain girls in schools but drop out crisis has remained as major challenge in Chari Zone of Kom Sub County.

Today the completion of basic education system that is primary has become preliquisite for any learner. The social economic consequences of dropping of school without a certificate are severe.

The research proposal is aimed at assessment of the impact of high girl child dropout rate in this zone. The study use questionnaire and interview guide to the teachers, school administrators and parents.

The study will be carried in selected public primary school in Chari zone. The purpose of this study therefore is to assess the impact of high girl child dropout rate from school in Kom Sub County. The views from interviewees are used to establish main cause of high dropout rate in this area and also help the researcher to make recommendation of how to curb the problem of high drop rate in school.
