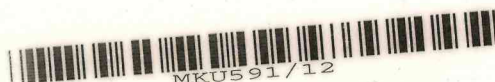

ABSTRACT

This study sought to identify the income generating activities in secondary schools. The research objectives included finding out income generating activities conducted by schools in Ugunja division, the types and nature of the projects, how these activities are conducted and to determine how these projects have benefited the lives of those involved in these projects

The sample consisted of different head/ deputy head teachers, the teachers, parents, students and the workers from various schools in Ugunja division and they were sampled purposively. Questioners and surveys were used to collect data which was analyzed using descriptive statistics and content analysis.

Result of the study proved that income generating activities are an alternative means of financing secondary education. It was therefore advisable that schools that were facing challenges in financing their activities were supposed to come up with such projects. It was also found that these projects were very beneficial to the schools and their stakeholders. Establishment of such projects was encouraged to other schools.

One of the recommendations was that the students should be involved in these income generating activities so as they learn real-life skills in farming and entrepreneurial skills.
