ABSTRACT

This study was aimed to determine the roles of NGOs on children's welfare in Korogocho slum. The study was focused on the services and roles of NGOs in Nairobi, specifically at Korogocho slum. The specific objective of the research was as the following to explore strategies by NGOs to eliminate child labour, to examine way which NGOs reduce children hunger and malnutrition, to assess approached by which NGOs eliminate child illiteracy and to evaluate method used by NGOs to reduce children unhealthy live. The research adopted a descriptive research design as there were variables which could not be quantified but could only be described. Through random stratified sampling method the researcher selected 20 respondents out total population of 26. Data was collected through the administering of questionnaire to the respondent. Qualitative and quantitative techniques of data analysis were used to collect data and the finding presented through charts and tables for simple understanding of the finding. The study found that out of poverty, alcoholism, childlabour, malnutrition, child violence and abuse, illiteracy are some of the needs and challenges children face at Korogocho slum and most of NGOs deal and try to address so of this needs. The study recommended that the local authority and other stakeholders to support international and local NGOs on providing children's wellbeing.
