ABSTRACT.

This research project is going to focus on the relationship between unemployment and robbery with violence among the youths, a case study of Kawangware in Nairobi County. In this study I examined the contribution of unemployment to robbery with violence in Kawangware. The specific objective are to investigate the types of crime conducted in Kawangware analyze the level of robbery with violence as a result of unemployment among the youths. The scope of the study was to find out the reason why robbery with violence affects the youths in Kawangware more than any other group of individuals. The objectives of the research are; To establish the relationship between robbery with violence and unemployment in Kawangware, to identify the age group of the community members who mostly engage in the criminal activities, To find out what can be done to limit violent crimes in Kawangware, the measures and security strategies, to establish who are the persons who should ensure safety and security in Kawangware, residents, the government through law enforcement authority or both.
